



# NDIS JOBS GROWTH: LOGAN REDLANDS NDIS REGION

Building Tomorrow's NDIS Workforce

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) will roll out across the Logan Redlands NDIS region from 1 July 2018 and this will mean up to 3,876 new jobs across the region over the next few years.

## WHAT IS THE NDIS

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) is the new way of providing support for Australians with disability, their families and carers.

The NDIS will provide about 460,000 Australians under the age of 65 with a permanent and significant disability with the reasonable and necessary support they need to live an ordinary life.

The NDIS supports people with disability to build skills and capability so they can participate in the community and employment.

## WHERE WILL THE NDIS JOBS OCCUR ACROSS THE LOGAN REDLANDS NDIS REGION?

The NDIS will support people with disability across the whole region. WorkAbility Qld estimates there will be between 2,100 and 3,876 new NDIS jobs created in the Logan Redlands NDIS region. The table below shows how many jobs are expected in the major Local Government Areas in the region.

## WHAT KIND OF JOBS WILL BE AVAILABLE AS A RESULT OF THE NDIS?

A wide variety of new NDIS jobs will be available. The large majority will be individual support workers who work directly with people with a disability and their families. There will be additional demand for therapists and therapy assistants. There will also be new roles to support business operations as disability organisations grow.
